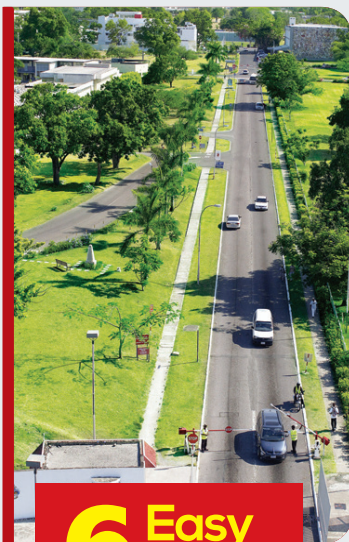

MONA SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

Bachelor of Science (B.Sc Engineering) - Civil, Computer Systems, Electronics and Electrical Power

Three Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language, Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics **AND** 2 double Units Cape or 2 GCE A Level passes in Pure/Pure and Applied Mathematics and Physics **OR** Equivalent qualifications from approved tertiary institutions
- **Note:** Holders of Associate degrees or diplomas from approved Caribbean tertiary level-institutions must possess a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.5 or 65% and above



FACULTY OF HUMANITIES & EDUCATION (Education-Based) (B.Ed.)

Three Years (without Teacher Training) Full-Time

(History, English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies/Geography and Language Education: Literacy Studies, Computer Science/Information Technology Education)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) including English Language **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 GCE A-level subjects in a relevant area
 - Two Years Full-Time or Three Years Part-Time (Teacher Trained) Teachers' College Certificate in a relevant area plus 4 CSEC grades (I-III) / GCE O'Level (Grades A-C) including English Language
- OR**
- Three years Secondary Teachers' College Diploma in relevant area + English Language

FACULTY OF HUMANITIES & EDUCATION (Humanities-Based) (B.A.)

Three Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grade A-C) including English Language **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 GCE A-Level subjects (one of which must be a Humanities subject for which courses are taught at the University). Strongly recommended: A foreign language. Individuals without a foreign language pass at CSEC will be required to take at least one basic foreign language course
- Applicants for the Entertainment and Cultural Enterprise Management and Computer Science Programme must have CSEC/BGCSE Mathematics

Four Years Part-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) including English Language. Strongly recommended: A foreign language. Individuals without a foreign language pass, at least at CSEC, will be required to take at least one of the basic foreign language courses



FACULTY OF LAW LL.B

Bachelor of Laws (LL.B)

Three Years Full-Time/Five-Six Years Part-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 GCE A-Level (passes with highly competitive grades)
- OR**
- An associate degree from an approved tertiary level institution with highly competitive GPA
- OR**
- A bachelor's or master's degree from an approved university



FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES (B.Sc.)

Three Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language and Mathematics **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 GCE A-Level subjects

NOTE: Departmental requirements apply for B.Sc. Social Work (2 references, personal statement, co-curricular form and/or interview).

Four Years Part-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) with compulsory English Language and Mathematics

FACULTY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES

A.Sc. Child Development Therapy

Two Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Levels/BGCSE (Grades A-C) in English Language, Mathematics, Biology
- NOTE:** Departmental requirement (2 references). Mature entry (applicants must be over 21 years) recognition of experience in the field will be considered

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MB,BS) Doctor of Dental Surgery (D.D.S) / Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M)

Five Years Full-Time (applicants must be at least 18 years old in the year of admission)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/ BGCSE (Grades A-C) in English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics **AND** 3 double Units CAPE subjects or 3 A-Level subjects including Chemistry, Biology and any other subject

NOTE: Physics and Mathematics are compulsory at the CSEC/BGCSE level, whereas Biology and Chemistry are compulsory at CAPE/A-Levels

- OR**
- UWI introductory year in Science & Technology courses in Biology, Chemistry and one other subject
- OR**
- Triple Major Associate from an approved community college degree majoring in Biology, Chemistry and one other subject, with GPA 3.5 or greater
- OR**
- Equivalent qualifications (as determined from transcripts)

Non-Academic considerations

- All candidates are required to submit a short autobiographic sketch outlining the reasons for their career choice (300 words or less). Candidate must also produce evidence of their involvement in relevant extra-curricular/co-curricular activities, socially-oriented projects and voluntary community service in the year prior to their application
- Applicants are required to submit a police record by March 31

Entry Level Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD)

Five Years Full-Time (applicants must be at least 18 years old in year of admission) See requirements to MB,BS; D.D.S. & D.V.M

Additional requirements for Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD.)

- Applicants will be required to attend an interview, either in person or via Skype
- Two letters of recommendation from individual who can attest to the candidate's character, scientific ability and work experience

B.Sc. Diagnostic Imaging (Radiography)

Three Years Full-Time

- Six CSEC subjects, (General Proficiency Grades I-III or equivalent) in English Language, Mathematics or Physics, Biology or Human and Social Biology, one other science subject, in addition to two other subjects. Applicants must attend an interview

B.Sc. Nursing

Four Years Full-Time (applicants should be at least 17 years old at the time of admission)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language, Biology/ Human and Social Biology, Mathematics and two other approved subjects **AND** Two double Units at CAPE in at least one of the following: Mathematics, Physics, Biology and any other subject area, as specified by the Nursing Council of Jamaica
- Applicants may be required to attend an interview

B.Sc. Physical Therapy

Three Years Full-Time (applicants should be at least 18 years old at the time of admission)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/ BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language, Mathematics and Biology **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 A-Level subjects, chosen from Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology
- Complete 60 voluntary hours in a physical therapy facility at the time of admission; at least 30 of which must be spent in a general hospital. Candidate must make their own arrangements for doing voluntary hours
- Applicant must attend an interview

Bachelor of Basic Medical Sciences (BB MedSci)

Three Years Full-Time (Options: Anatomy, Biochemistry, Physiology and Pharmacology)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) in English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics **AND** 2 double Units CAPE subjects or 2 A-Level subjects chosen from Chemistry, Biology/Zoology, Physics/Mathematics
- OR**
 - UWI Preliminary Science & Technology Courses – Chemistry, Life Sciences, Physics, Mathematics
- OR**
 - Equivalent qualifications (as determined from transcripts)

NOTE: Students registered in the Bachelor of Basic Medical Sciences Programme cannot transfer to the (MB,BS) Programme. However, on completion students can apply to the MB,BS Programme where credit may be granted.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS



FACULTY OF SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY (B.SC.)

Three Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language, Mathematics, and at least two approved laboratory science subjects **AND** 2 double Units CAPE or GCE A-Level chosen from Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science

Four Years Full-Time (Preliminary Level)

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which include English Language, Mathematics, **AND** two approved laboratory science subjects. **Special department requirements (in addition to requirements above)**

Actuarial Science

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) and/or GCE O'Level/BGCSE (Grades A-C) which must include English Language, Mathematics **AND** Two double Units CAPE in Mathematics and one other subject with highly competitive grades

Horticulture

- Applicants must have passes at the CSEC level in the following: English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Geography, Chemistry and passes at the CAPE Level in Biology, Geography or Chemistry **OR** an associate degree in an appropriate discipline



INSTITUTE FOR GENDER & DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

Three Years Full-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) or GCE O'Level/ BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) which must include English Language and Mathematics **AND** Two double Units CAPE subjects or 2 GCE A-Level subjects

Four Years Part-Time

- Five CSEC subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-III) or GCE O'Level/BGCSE subjects (Grades A-C) in English Language and Mathematics (compulsory)

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

English Language is compulsory for admission to all programmes at The University of the West Indies. Candidates who do not possess a Grade I in CSEC English A, a Grade A in GCE O'Level/BGCSE English Language, Grade 1 or 2 in CAPE Communication Studies or a Grade A in the GCE General Paper, are required to take an English Language Proficiency Test on entry.

Applicants whose first language is not English must perform satisfactorily in an approved English Language Test, such as International English Language Testing System Test (IELTS) **OR** the Test of English for Foreign Language (TOEFL). OTHER ACCEPTABLE QUALIFICATIONS

- Associate degree (A.Sc.) from approved Caribbean tertiary level institutions with a minimum GPA of 2.5 and above are considered as having satisfied normal matriculation requirements for entry to certain faculties. In specific instances credit/exemptions may be given in respect to level 1 courses. A higher GPA is required in order to obtain credit/exemption based on A.Sc degrees.
